Details, details... details!

When do we document our program/school/activity?

March 1, 2006 is the official day to record any aspect of your one-to-one learning environment.

When do we turn in our media taken on March 1, 2006?

From mid March through mid April we will have our website ready for media submissions. You will have the four-week to complete the submission process of turning in the media and other information. The web addresses will be made available by March 1, 2006.

When can we edit and process our media that was taken on March 1?

You have the entire month of March in which to process your media. The only requirement is that the media be taken on March 1, 2006. Editing movies, sound files, and other media may be done after that date.

When will the site be completed and available for viewing?

We will be debuting our site at NECC 2006, in San Diego. Our site will be live from that point forward.

What are our limits for the quantity and size of media files?

We will have exact limitations set soon. Right now we are limiting quantity to the following:

- Per participant registered a total of: 1 movie file, 1-2 audio files, 10 digital images, etc. These numbers might be increased depending upon the sponsorship we receive from companies willing to help fund the program.
- Exact file sizes will be set by March 1, 2006.

Each item submitted must have text to go with it. The text should explain the content of the media so that the viewer will understand what the media represents. We will have some samples available prior to the time to submit media.

What about copyright and permission to use images/media with students?

Each entry must complete a permission-release form stating that the educational institution submitting the media already has obtained full permission to use the images, media and other material. This form will be available on the site by March 1, 2006. All music and other media used within the "Day in the Life" submissions must have copyright permissions included with the submission.
