## 10 Low-Cost Cooperative Activities for Families





- Create a toy from recycled materials and spare parts found around your house. Have a family sharing session so that each person can show off their new creations!
- 2. Take turns finding a favorite recipe and prepare it for a family meal.
- Have a backyard family movie night and S'more Party where you take turns telling silly stories.
- 4. Add calmness to your afternoon with a painting session. It's a great way to express your child's creativity and vision. Hang up the painting in your child's new "home office."

- 5. Enjoy outdoor physical activity with a scavenger hunt. Each day a different person designs challenge cards or uses the GooseChase app.
- 6. Have an Unconference where a family member presents something they are passionate about and strategize how to help each other make these ideas come to life.
- 7. Make up your own dance or "code" a dance from Code.org's Dance Party. Or take a <u>free online dance class</u> as a family.
- 8. Design your own dream LEGO or paper #StoryCity, design an imaginary playground setting, or even a neighborhood rock garden from recycled art and play building materials.

- 9. Make a chalk game on the sidewalk for neighbors to play using "Hot Lava", Hop Scotch, and silly directions like "walk backwards five steps" or "do the hokey pokey!"
- 10. Play the game "Heads Up" on your phone or—better yet—have children create clues and picture cards on index cards to use during your next family game night.
