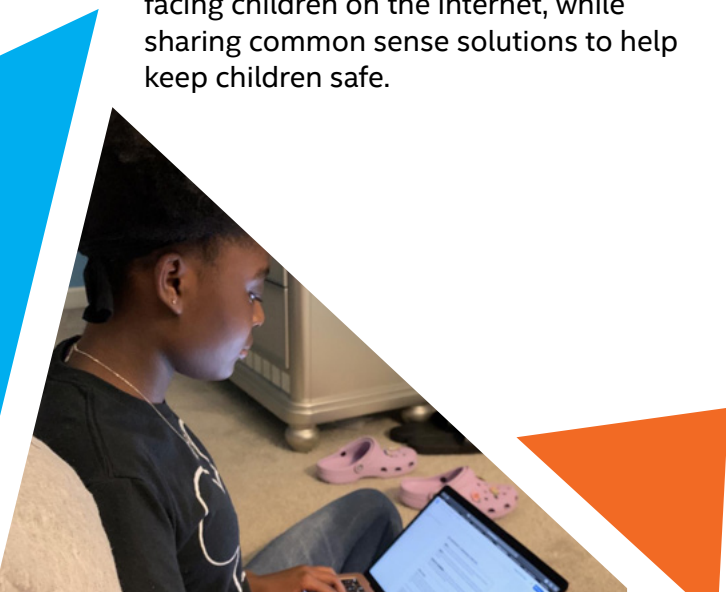
As uncomfortable as the conversation may be, not talking to children about the many dangers they face when going online will not make these dangers go away.
